

CALL FOR ABSTRACTS Abstract Submission Is Now Open



The South African Monitoring & Evaluation Association (SAMEA) takes pleasure in inviting you to take part in its 6th Biennial SAMEA Conference to be held at the Hilton Hotel in Sandton, Johannesburg, South Africa from 23-27 October 2017.

The theme for this year's conference is: 'Purpose-driven Monitoring and Evaluation'

This Conference is a key pillar of the SAMEA strategy to broaden the evaluation community and to increase commitment amongst evaluation users and decision-makers to use quality evidence for informed decision making. The Conference outcomes and strands are as follows:

Conference Strand 5: Strengthening the Monitoring and Evaluation Profession

Through this theme of the conference there will be discussions and debates on the use of evaluation as it pertains to measurable improvements in the human condition.

The Conference will bring together commissioners, practitioners and researchers as part of SAMEA's mandate to grow a community of SA evaluators and to strengthen the evaluation community. The M&E community will be provided an opportunity to take stock of what others are doing in the field and engage with the state of development of M&E in South Africa with international comparisons; stimulate debate and research around M&E practice, promote the integration of theory and practice in M&E, and its role in society, given the specific development and service delivery challenges South Africa faces. The Conference also provides a platform for SAMEA as a VOPE to promote its national and international profile.

SAMEA hereby invite all stakeholders - M&E practitioners from the public, private and development spheres to submit paper, panel, or infographic abstracts presenting M&E systems, processes and practices within the broad theme of the conference; to submit a proposal for the pre-conference workshops on contemporary M&E paradigms, methods and tools, or scarce skills; or to register for the conference to learn from international and local experts.

ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

The conference is structured in a manner that encourages a diverse representation of stakeholders and participants from South Africa and around the world. A variety of platforms will be utilised at the conference, such as capacity-building workshops, paper presentations, panel discussions, networking sessions and exhibitions by monitoring and evaluation students, researchers, practitioners and professionals.

The 5 day event comprises 2 days of pre-conference professional development workshops, and will include international experts who will share their time and experience with participants over a range of practical, learning sessions. In the past many of these have been oversubscribed, and we expect to offer between 8-10 workshops again this year. The actual conference comprises 2 days, and includes international and local key note speakers who inform the M&E profession, paper sessions on successful and innovative practices, roundtable discussions on emerging practices, panel debates by selected experts and a host of exhibits, networking and social opportunities.





ABSTRACTS

SAMEA invites you to contribute to the programme by submitting an Abstract for an Oral, Round Table or infographic presentation.

Through the theme of the conference: **'Purpose-driven Monitoring and Evaluation'** there will be discussions and debates on the use of evaluation as it pertains to measurable improvements in the human condition.

The conference will focus on the following strands:

Conference Strand 1: Strengthening Performance Monitoring Systems

Conference Strand 2: Enhancing Data Management and Visualisation

Conference Strand 3: Using Evidence for Decision Making

Conference Strand 4: Lessons learnt from evaluation case studies

Conference Strand 5: Strengthening the Monitoring and Evaluation Profession

Abstracts submission need to focus on any one of the conference strand above, and need to be contextually located within one of the sectors described below.

SAMEA is also accepting proposals for Pre-Conference Training Workshops.

Pre-conference workshops are designed to expose participants to specific evaluation skills, innovative methods or develop capacity in the utilisation of specific tools. Papers, roundtables and infographic should also respond to the thematic areas represented by each strand.

Paper – Oral Presentations

Written papers that are orally presented at the Conference usually engage in a critical debate in the thematic areas represented in each conference strand. The paper could define the problem the conference strand seeks to address; and/or provide case studies that uses variety of quality evidence to provide innovative solutions.

Abstracts for paper are due by 15 June 2017.

Round Table Sessions

Round Tables usually entail work-in-progress on an evaluation. In these, authors make available a manuscript for debate to clarify, strengthen argumentation, consider next steps, and the like, and aim to assist the author complete the manuscript with the view to publication. An abstract on the written manuscript of the paper in progress with issues for discussion in the Round Table is required by **15 June 2017**.

Infographic presentations (Posters)

Infographic presentations entail a poster size presentation with visual representation (graphs, diagrams, photos) as well as text. Infographics could depict an evaluation study including: questions asked in the study through methodology, data, findings and conclusion; and may include specific case-study/studies. Infographics will be displayed, and presenters need to be available to respond to questions asked about the infographic when on display.

The closing date for submissions is 15 June 2017.

All abstracts will be reviewed and scored. Authors will be informed of the outcome of their submission(s) by 18 July 2017.

All accepted speakers to confirm acceptance by 26 July 2017. A full paper will be required by 01 September 2017
