Rules 'Epelle-moi Afrique du Sud'

(French Spelling Bee) 2020/2021





Égalité Fraternité

General rules

- Contestants will receive the word in English and will have to translate it first in French and then spell it, using the French alphabet.
- During the competition, contestants will be selected through 3 phases. During the last phase, contestants have ONE MINUTE to correctly spell as many words as possible in French. Contestants do NOT need to spell the article, JUST the noun.

	Déroulé	Niveau	Critères de sélection
PHASE 1	Warm-up lap then each participant must spell a word drawn randomly.	MIDDLE	If the spelling is correct, the student is selected for the next phase.
PHASE 2	Each participant must spell a maximum number of words in one minute. Words drawn randomly.	SUPERIOR	The winners are the students who can spell as many words as possible in one minute.
PHASE 3	Each participant must spell a word. We keep going until we have a winner.	SUPERIOR/ DIFFICULT/ VERY DIFFICULT	The winner is the one who can spell as many words as possible correctly.

4 levels for the words' list

1. MEDIUM	3. DIFFICULT
2. SUPERIOR	4. VERY DIFFICULT

In the event of a tie-break, the number of passes that each contestant made will be counted. The contestant with the least number of passes will win.

*If contestants still have a tied score, a decider round will be played. Contestants will spell a word in turn, until one of them spells a word incorrectly. This continues until there is a winner (and a runner-up). Contestants are given equal number of words to spell. There is no time limit on a decider round.

Points' system:

- 1 point is rewarded for each word translated and spelt correctly. *Warning*: NO point rewarded if translated correctly BUT wrong spelling.
- Pronunciation must be clear and words spelt out properly.
 Clarity is of the utmost importance. If the judge is not able to understand a letter or word, a point will not be awarded.
- The judge's decision is final on whether they heard a letter or spelling.
- Accents and punctuation must be voiced during the spelling according to the rules regarding accents (see Accents/Terminology).
- If a Contestant runs out of time during the spelling of a word, they should be allowed to finish the word that they started.
- If a Contestant runs out of time before starting to spell the word, no point is awarded.
- Contestants can 'pass' a word anytime, BUT must say in French "je passe".

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- Each school can send a total of 2 or 3 students to take part to the regional final.
- Regional and National winners will be announced on the day of the final and a prize ceremony will take place.

THE JURY

The jury is made of 4 main characters:

- the Jury Master
- the Time Master
- the Points Master
- the Spell Master
- The Jury Master asks each contestant 'Are you ready?' "êtes-vous prêt". After the contestant agrees they are ready to begin, the clock is started. (1min challenge)
- The Jury listens to each word and keeps score during each contestant's one-minute time slot / word spelt. Provided that all agree the correct spelling of that word, one point is awarded. Contestants are tested individually without prompts.
- The judge's decision is final on whether they heard a letter or spelling.



PARTICIPANTS:



- Contestants face the jury.
- Contestants will hear the word, translate it into the target language then spell it using the French alphabet, following the formula SAY IT, SPELL IT.
- Contestants must translate the word with the correct article, but they only need to spell the noun.
- Accents and punctuation must be voiced during the spelling according to the rules set out below (see Accents/Terminology).
- Contestants must speak clearly with sufficient volume. If the judge cannot hear the Contestant, the judge will indicate and a re-spell takes place immediately. The clock is NOT stopped for this action.
- Clarity is of the utmost importance. If the judge is not able to understand a letter or word, a point will not be awarded. The Jury Master decision is final on whether they heard a letter or spelling.
- If Contestants are not sure that they have heard the word correctly, they are responsible for requesting that the word be repeated. The clock is NOT stopped for this action.
- Contestants cannot alter the order of the letters once they have completed their spelling of the word but they can stop mid-word and start again from the beginning.
- If a contestant runs out of time during the spelling of a word, they should be allowed to finish the word that they started.
- If a contestant If a contestant runs out of time before starting to spell the word, no point is awarded.
- Contestants must remain quiet when not spelling. Contestants causing disruption will be warned and if the disruption continues they may be disqualified.
